5 This course is not designed to make you a rappelling expert, just proficient in observing what is dangerous and unsafe and being familiar with the BSA current guidelines. Must be retaken every 2 years. Units cannot go to indoor rock wall camps, commercial establishments or anywhere unless at least one leader PRESENT has taken this course.

6 This course is not designed to make you a swimming instructor or expert, just proficient in observing what is dangerous and unsafe and being familiar with the BSA current guidelines. Must be retaken every 2 years. Units cannot go to indoor pools, outdoor pools, or the YMCA, just because they have lifeguards or trained staff. Units must have at least one leader PRESENT who has this course.

7 This course is not designed to make you a boating expert, just proficient in observing what is dangerous and unsafe and being familiar with the BSA current guidelines. Must be retaken every 2 years. Units cannot go boating, canoeing, or Whitewater Rafting even if there are lifeguards or trained staff. The unit must have least one leader PRESENT who has this course.

### SUPPLEMENTAL TRAINING FOR ADULT LEADERS

-Monthly Roundtables for Cub and Scout Leaders. Usually 1.5 to 2 hours.

-PowWow or Show-N-Do. A one day event of program ideas & skills for Cub and Scout leaders. Usually held every other year.

-Performance (On the job). One on One with the District Executive or other District/Council member.

-CPR certification. Required for adults attending high adventure camps. Available through American Heart Association, American Red Cross or other medical agencies.

Individuals who want to be District or Council Trainers should take the Trainer Development Course or if they had taken the TiT course, the Trainer Refresher Course.

Individuals who are District Level Chair Persons should take Youth Protection, Health and Safety and attend the Annual District Committee Workshop.
